Experience the magic of a full moon ski. Energize for the holiday season under the bright light of the full moon.

We'll meet at the Glen Alps trailhead at 7:00 pm. We plan to ski to the German Club Bridge along the Powerline Trail and return a total distance of 6 miles. Depending on weather and light conditions, and our fun-o-meter, expect to return back at the Glen Alps Trailhead between 9 and 10 pm.

The trail is relatively flat, wide and easy to ski. Be prepared for cold, wind, and good times. You'll need warm clothes, water and food for breaks and a long break stop at the midway point. We advise folks to bring a headlamp along and check the batteries before skiing. To park at the trailhead you'll need either a Alaska State Parks season pass or pay 5 bucks for a day pass at the obtainable at the trailhead.

If the wind kicks up we will probably switch this ski to the Upper Huffman trailhead which you find driving left off of Upper Huffman Road instead of right towards Glen Alps. If there is a snowmachine opening, doubtful at this point, we'll ski from the Prospect Heights trailhead near Upper O'Malley. There may be an issue with the lack of snow.
